The Feast of Saint Francis-Sunday, October 6th

St. John's Parish Annual Observance of the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi is scheduled for Sunday, October 6th, 12:00 o'clock noon to 1:00 p.m. Please spread the word to your neighbors and friends and extend an invitation to them. In case of rain, we'll move indoors to St. John's Sanctuary.

Just Who Was Saint Francis of Assisi?

Born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone in 1182 at Assisi, Saint Francis was an Italian Catholic "friar" (monk), deacon and preacher. He was a son of a prosperous Italian silk merchant and a French noblewoman. His father was in France on business when Francis was born in Assisi and his mother had him baptized as Giovanni. His father later took to calling his son Francesco *("the Frenchman")*. The spendthrift son of privilege, young "Franceso" lived the high life and was a fan of the **troubadour movement;** made up of traveling composers and performers of songs about chivalry and courtly love. Many themes were humorous or even vulgar satires. Francis' 'conversion experience' came during his military service. Taken




captive, he suffered from a serious illness that caused him to re-evaluate his life. Ultimately, Francis founded a religious order of men that we know now as **Franciscans** or **The Order of Friars Minor**. Francis received the Minor Orders of the Church but never aspired to be ordained a Priest. He was, eventually, ordained a Deacon. In 1219, in the midst of the **Fifth Crusade**, Francis traveled to Egypt to negotiate with Sultan al-Kamil, nephew of the famed

Saladin, during a ceasefire in the Muslim brutality and the atrocities committed by Crusading knights. The Sultan received Francis, as envoy, and allowed him to speak or *preach* to the Muslims. without effect. Late sources record that the Sultan gave Francis permission to visit the contested **sacred places in the Holy Land.** Francis' attempt at rapprochement with Muslim hordes occupying the Holy Land would have far reaching repercussions. To this day, the Franciscan Order remains the sole and **"Official Custodian of the Holy Places"** of the Holy Land for the Catholic Church and all Christianity. St. Francis created the very first "Nativity Scene" at Christmas, using live animals and 'actors'. Francis revered all of God's creation and is known today as the **Patron Saint of the Environment** *(as well as Patron Saint of Italy)* from his preaching about "all creation" and our Christian responsibility to be good stewards of the earth and all life. Folklore surrounding his life describes Francis as having 'conversations' with the birds of the air and called all creatures *(i.e. animals)* his "brothers" and "sisters". (*See "Canticle of the Sun"*) Francis' official Feast Day in the Episcopal and Roman Catholic Calendars of Saints is **Oct. 4th**
